 - ↪ Acoustic discretion
 - ↪ Ocean noise
 - ↪ Diving in unclear water
- Diving equipment
 - ↪ Sensors for vital constant measurements (ECG, EEG, temperature, scanner, ...)
 - ↪ Data transmission
 - ↪ Dive site markers (following buoys...)
- Diving accidents
 - ↪ Medical prevention
 - ↪ Criticality evaluation (pulmonary oedema...)
 - ↪ Diving emergency management procedures
 - ↪ Diver drift prevention
